

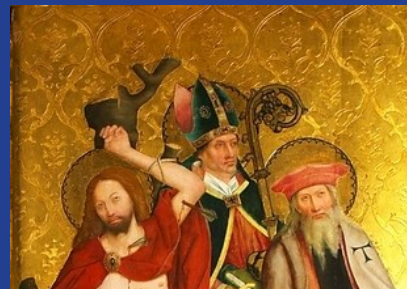

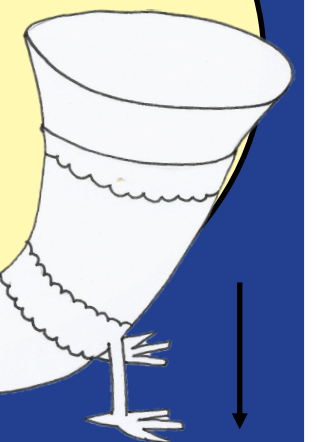

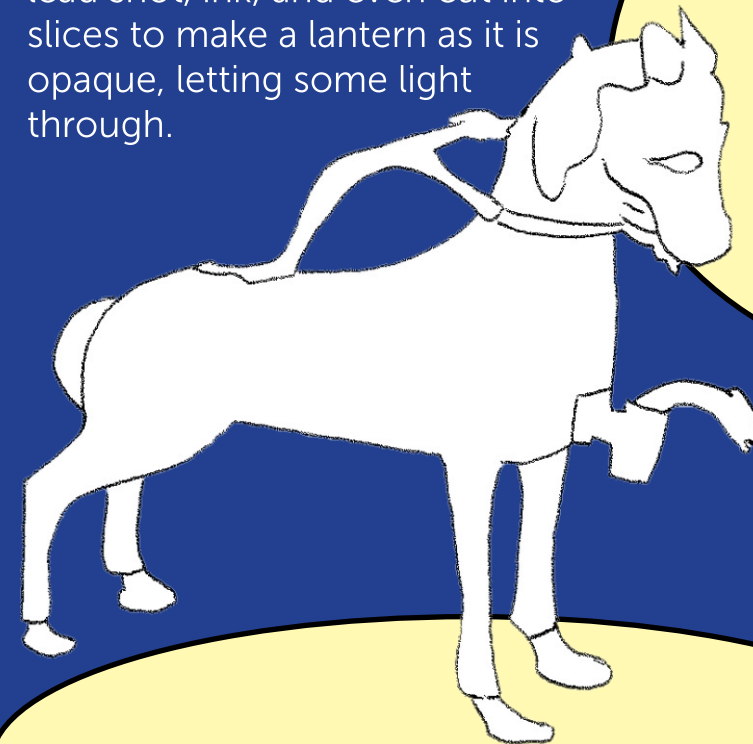

This carving of Thomas à Becket 12th century, is made from _____Ivory.

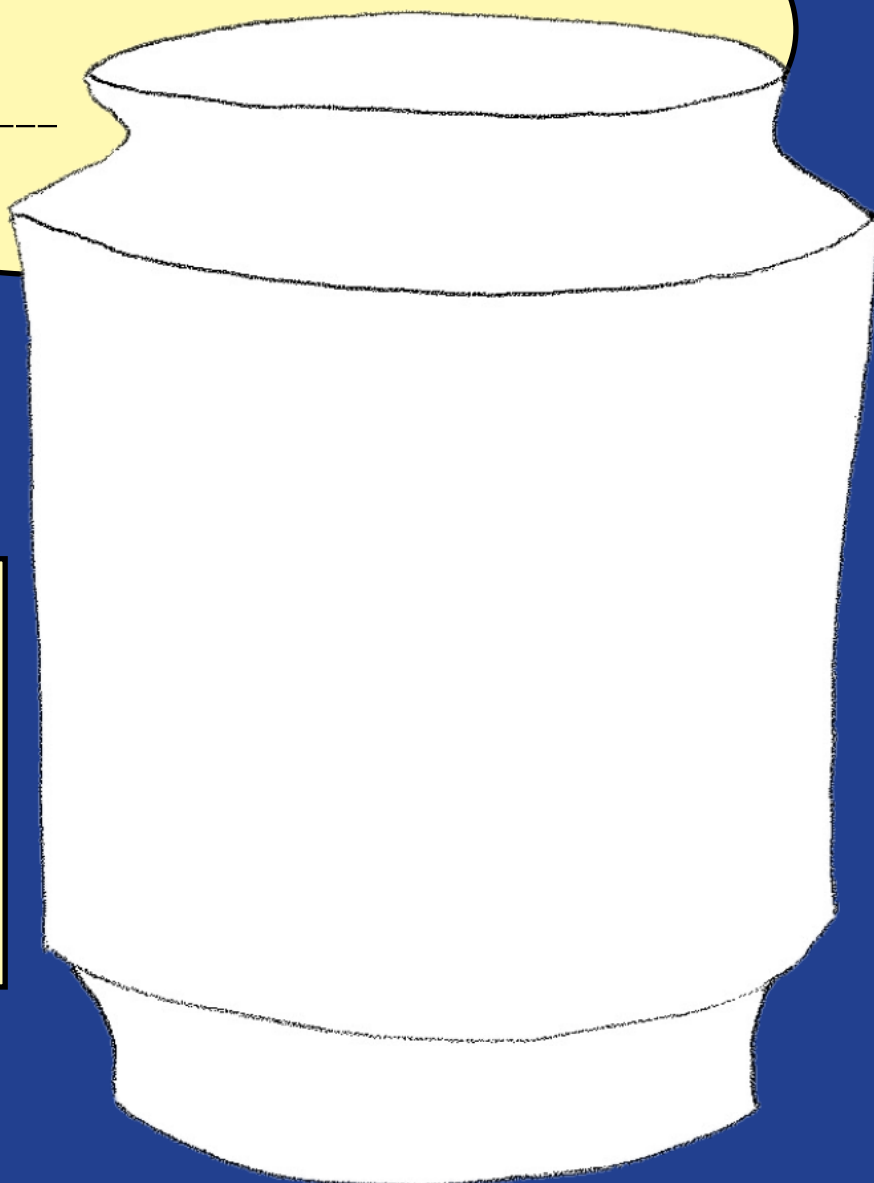

An **Artifact** is an object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.

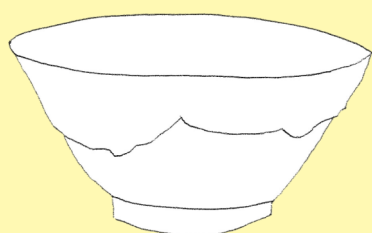
In Case 7 can you find the Majolica Jar that looks like this? Can you fill in the design?

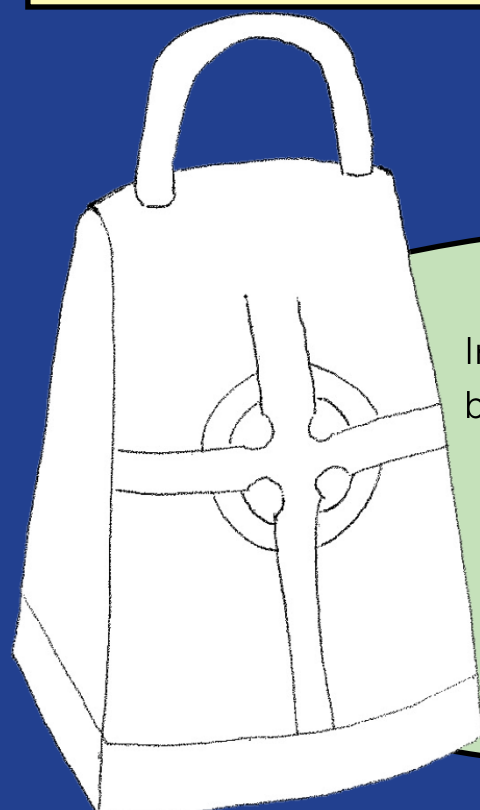


Answer: It was used to hold the

The Antrim Cross's central raised boss is unusual. It is the shape of a pyramid and has tiny carved animals which help to date it to the early to mid 9th century. However its metal and shape suggest it could be 7th century.
